

NOTICE: TREE AND BRUSH REMOVAL

Hydro One is working to ensure a safe and reliable supply of power is maintained to the City of Hamilton

Why is vegetation maintenance important?

It's our responsibility to ensure that trees and other vegetation remain within a safe distance to the high-voltage power lines and towers that power your community. Maintenance ensures that the corridor is safe for public use, and our crews have safe access to perform emergency repairs on the power lines.

What work will be completed?

In order to maintain a safe distance between vegetation and the high-voltage transmission lines, Hydro One will remove trees and brush that pose a risk to the electricity system. This work includes the removal of a dense section of trees and brush at the entrance of Confederation Park, and the removal of vegetation at tower bases.

After the dense section of trees and brush is removed, our crews will seed with a pollinator mix to provide a habitat for bees, butterflies and wildlife. Please note that pollinator habitats take two years to reach full maturity.

How will the work be completed?

To complete this work, Hydro One will use:

- Heavy Mechanical equipment, such as grinders and bulldozers
- Manual equipment, such as chainsaws and pruners
- Low-volume, low-pressure government approved herbicide may be applied to certain cut stems to prevent regrowth. This is **not** a broad-spray application of herbicide.


Our crews will do their best to minimize any inconvenience for residents and users of the trails located on the corridor.
