In December of 2020, our community was made aware of a Transport Canada plan to go ahead with closing the Hamilton and Burlington Canal piers. To make matters worse a supposed lawsuit in which someone slipped and fell on the pier added to their reasons for the closure. I founded the Facebook group "Save Our Pier - Hamilton Beach Community" and collected over 2000 signatures for a government petition, which was an overwhelming success. On the petition we had a resident in every single province and territory sign their support to keep pedestrian access to our piers. Throughout 2021, Transport Canada kept pedestrian access to our piers and also completed some repair work. It wasn't until December of 2021 that they erected the barrier which still stands there today and has kept our community off the piers well into the spring without a permanent solution.

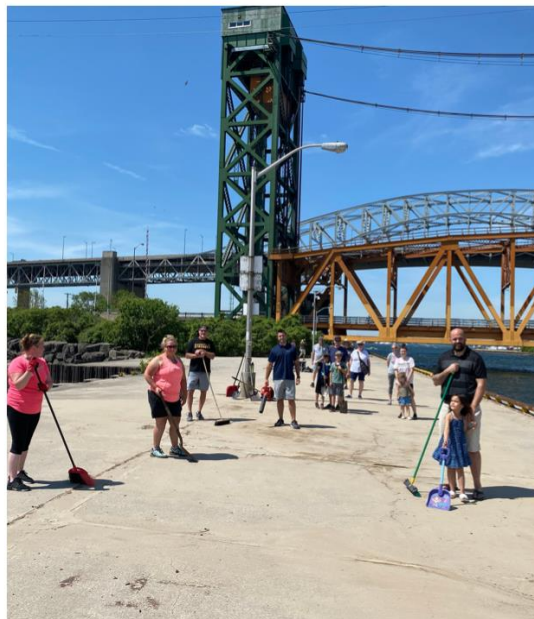
I have been working hard to find answers as to why our piers have closed for the first time in over 100 years and when they will reopen permanently for our community to enjoy. I understand that discussions are taking place between Transport Canada and the Hamilton Oshawa Port Authority (HOPA) which could see HOPA take on the liability for the piers and lease the surface of the piers out to the respective municipalities, much like the pier in Oshawa. This arrangement could give the municipalities the chance to implement improvements such as benches, lighting, garbage cans, street sweeping, etc. I will make sure that nothing is done without consulting our community first, which I will bring to the Hamilton Beach Community Council.

Our community must continue uniting together to see this through! Progress will not happen unless we pressure the municipalities.

Please join our Facebook group and be apart of an exciting opportunity to transform the entire area and give the lands the attention they so deserve. We will be organizing a pier cleanup once again and a time and date will be posted on the Save Our Pier Facebook group (weather permitting). Hamilton has some of the best waterfront property in the province and it is massively under-utilized. This is our chance to do something special for coming generations to enjoy. Thank you to everyone who has joined me to build this grassroots movement and helped to preserve and progress our community. We couldn't do this without you!

Save the Pier

Transport Canada wishes to permanently bar access and potentially redevelop the Lift Bridge pier structure to make it unusable to foot traffic. The Lift Bridge channel piers are a historical part and well used feature the Beach Strip. At the same time the Harbour Commission has development plans for the same piers. Matt Frances, previous community resident is spear heading a movement to retain access to the piers and also bring all parties to the table.

Signage Proposal on Eastport/QEW

MTO adjusted the Harbour commission's initial design, reducing sign size, and to one side facing down bound Niagara traffic. The Harbour commission has a mandate to share some proceeds of sign revenue with local communities. The HBCC declined a revenue stipend on the grounds that it would be a conflict of interest. The signs will affect Beach residents, and the HBCC has ongoing disputes over incompatible use and/or unacceptable storage of materials on the adjacent piers, such as salt, which adversely affects the Beach Strip.

Flood Management Study

- The City is embarking on another flood management study.

Beach Community Funds

- Beach Council Account has approximately \$300 to \$400
- Nevada Account -\$1709.79, donated \$535 to Hamilton Beach Easter Egg Hunt
- Funding comes from Nevada ticket sales at the Variety store, contributions from Ward 5 Councillor, and donations from members of the Community.
